Her recent books include Global Regionalisms and

Higher Education, and Public and Private Partnerships in Education (both Edward Elgar). Susan is founding editor of the journal Globalisation, Societies and Education, and currently editor-in chief.

The graduate seminar with Dr Susan Lee Robertson will discuss issues related to higher education, migration, security, and capitalism. In a forthcoming publication Robertson notes that growing divisions between communities in the UK, were fanned by a hostile government department whose tightening immigration and surveillance projects profoundly impacted the higher education sector in the United Kingdom. What do these cleavages tell us about the new forms of imperialism, and the cultural politics of neoliberalism and its material effects? How has this complex and shifting set of dynamics both shaped and been shaped by higher education policies, programmes, and practices?
